Sub - committee reports	The crime prevention sub – committee was the only sub – committee to meet. The other two committees did not meet. This persistent failure to meet must be addressed.	It was decided that a meeting will be held between the JPC chair, the chief superintendant and the chairs of the 3 sub – committees to see how to improve the efficiency of the subs. Chief Superintendent's Report	Summary of crime stats were provided for the 6 month period to June 2018 and compared with the same period last year. Under driving offences, phone usage is up but prosecution of seatbelts and speed offences is down. Property crime and burglary is down as is thefts from cars. (the acting super advised that they are looking at introducing a new unit to patrol beaches etc to deter thefts from cars). Serious assault is down although minor assaults are up.		

	<p>Traffic collisions are up from 9 to 13 with 2 fatalities in the period.</p> <p>It was reported that community engagement is working well with the Riverchapel initiative being a case in point and it is hoped that this type of engagement can be rolled out more comprehensively across the county.</p> <p>In conclusion, the acting Chief Superintendent announced that a new Chief Superintendent has now been appointed and will begin next week. He is Paddy McMenimin and is being promoted from Dublin.</p>		
AOB	<p>The Chair, Cllr M. Whelan, reported that he had a meeting with the Chief Super in Navan. What they discussed was the need for CCTV to be co-ordinated as a national initiative, JPC'S need to have more investment to be more relevant and effective, drug crime and "Designing out crime ". This is the notion that when estates are designed, a special view to reducing crime needs to be applied to the design. For example, no blind spots etc. The meeting concluded with a tour around the new Wexford Garda station.</p> <p>No date was set for the next JPC meeting and the meeting then concluded.</p>
