

## **JPC Meeting report**

The JPC meeting was held in the Council chamber, Wexford County Council, Carricklawn, Wexford on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2018 at 1130 AM

The agenda was as follows:

Following a roll call, the minutes of the previous JPC meeting were proposed and adopted. There were no matters arising from them.

The update from sub committees mainly concerned installation and stock taking of CCTV coverage in various towns and centres in Co. Wexford. Cllr Ireton spoke about the minimalist coverage in Gorey while in comparison, lesser population density areas had greater quantity of CCTV coverage. Some Councillors felt that the CCTV instruments were outdated needing replacement or upgrading.

Regarding Community/PPN representation for 2019 – 2024, David Doyle as PPN rep suggested that due process could be undertaken with inputs from Wexford PPN.

CCTV aspects are covered a/m.

The new Chief Superintendent of Garda Síochána introduced himself as a native of Tyrone with most of his previous work in Dublin. He was duly welcomed to the JPC. Superintendent Jim Doyle also voiced his welcome.

Correspondence from Janine Fitzgerald, of Community Section, Wexford Co Co was discussed. The problem of broken glass and bottles in various children's playgrounds in Enniscorthy and New Ross had been dealt with by added car patrols by G.S. '.

No further business was discussed under AOB.

Accidents and incidents are discussed at our monthly meeting with E Hore and he asked for an update re the damage to surfaces on the Town Park New Ross and Gimont playgrounds following the two reported incidents this month. If you could let me know, please, I would appreciate it. Could you send on the inspection reports for Gimount, thanks for the file.

It was also suggested that the on-going issue of broken glass (bottles and drinking glasses) in the playgrounds near Riverside Hotel and up at Supervalu / Petti's in Enniscorthy be raised at the JPC, suggesting they consider 'drive arounds' at night to monitor for any drinking in the playgrounds! Let me know if you agree / disagree.
