The meeting was informed that a cyber-crime unit has been set up in Wexford Also Ger O'Mahony, IFA rep has resigned due to taking up another position and has been replaced by Margaret Earle IFA

Discussion on CCTV around the county cameras are now in 6 locations Wexford more cameras to be added

Gorey to get additional 5 cameras to cover the Town Park

New Ross needs to be upgraded with 30/40 being added

Enniscorthy needs upgrading with the need for 30/40 more cameras

Bunclody county council to take over community run cameras with an additional 70 needed

The meeting was informed that due to data protection laws it was not possible to place cameras at known illegal dumping areas

The matter of caravans parking in holiday areas if they are parked illegally the Gardaí will move them.

Kieran Donoghue ceo of Fdys gave an update of their work with the youth of the county . They have set up a Popup Coffee shop in New Ross to engage with the youths of the area who are also anxious to have a youth club in New Ross In general there is a drug problem in Wexford and it was important to engage with 11- 20 year olds about the damage drugs can do to their health. It's important that youths are informed engaged and supported. The FYDS hope to set up a popup café in Wexford town .

The JPC need to support and encourage young people to engage and the JPC need to support youth workers.
