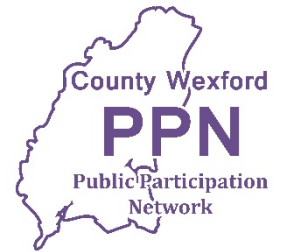

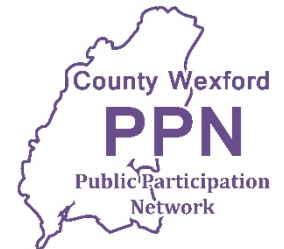

Summary of Meeting

- Welcome & Introductions were made by Simon Boyse.
- Breda Cahill gave a summary of the PPN structure and workings
- Simon Boyse summarised the minutes of the last MD meeting and gave an overview of the MD Council meeting report.
- Simon invited the group members to participate in an open-ended discussion where views and concerns could be shared.
- An Garda Síochána gave a presentation/discussion on community policing.

Summary of Discussion Points

There was a good broad discussion about the PPN in Rosslare.

Willie Considine raised concerns about the discussion of erosion of Wexford coastlines at recent LECP public consultations. He also suggested a rotating process for his place on the Housing SPC.

Ian confirmed that the PPN would be making a submission to the LECP and if groups had suggestions that they could contact us to be included in the submission and that the position of the Housing SPC seat would be reviewed.

Inspector Liam Kavanagh from An Garda Síochána gave a very good talk about community policing and support for PPN groups. Some of the issues faced by AGS include large turnover of staff, modernisation of the force and lack of feedback. The importance of creating a community feeling was discussed and Liam said he would look into further details on pop up Garda stations and more officers on the beat.

Another conversation included the use of drugs by younger people and explored how we could tackle this issue head on in schools, GAA clubs etc.
